Investigator Award

Overview

This training is for those who undertake the role of investigating incidents/accidents within the Railway Industry e.g. Driver Managers, Conductor Managers, Station Managers, Control Managers, etc.

Candidates attend a course and are registered with **City & Guilds**. Once they have completed the initial classroom training, they complete written questions and are mentored through two workplace incidents.

This produces a body of evidence that is then assessed by **AssessTech** Assessors, in order to award the **Investigator Award**, otherwise known as the **City & Guilds Level 3 NVQ Incident and Accident Investigator Award**. This is described in further detail below:

- Investigations into actual events
